

**ORDER BELOW EXHIBIT-1 IN REGULAR CIVIL SUIT NO. 49/2024**

Looking to the compromise *pursis* vide exhibit-13 which was recorded by this court in the presence of the parties and the learned advocates concerned after the contents were read over to the parties in their local language to which the parties had admitted no objection, the compromise decree is to be issued accordingly.

The Court has gone through the submissions of the parties and the documents produced. It seems to this court that the compromise is met with in this matter and therefore compromise decree must be issued to the parties with the condition that the said compromise decree must not hamper or prejudice the rights of any of the third party. The Court has relied on the compromise *pursis* and the submission made by the learned advocates for the parties. Therefore, if this compromise decree will affect any third party, it will stand **null** and **void** and the parties will not be able to take any legal recourse through compromise decree. In interest of justice, I pass the following order.

**ORDER**

1. The compromise decree is to be issued accordingly with the below mentioned condition.
2. Compromise decree must not hamper or prejudice the rights of any of the third party.
3. If this compromise decree will affect any third party, it will stand **null and void** and the parties will not be able to take any legal recourse through this compromise decree.
