The case was initially numbered as M.A. No.822/2024. On 27.07.2026,
both the claimant and the 2nd respondent were present and they agreed to settle

the claim for Rs.2,25,000/- as full and final settlement. Hence the said M.A. case was converted into MCOP No.5634/2026 U/s.166 of M.V. Act and Rule 3 of MACT Rules.

As per the FIR, on 28.03.2024 at about 05.45 p.m., while the petitioner was riding his motorcycle bearing Registration No.TN10 AF 4012 from Virugambakkam to Vadapalani, near Arcot Salai, Avichi College Police Booth, CMRL Pillar No. 81, the driver of the Car bearing Registration No.TN12 AY 1049, which was proceeding ahead of him, suddenly opened the car door without any signal. As a result, the petitioner fell down and sustained injuries to his right leg and suffered bleeding injuries.

AWARD

2. When the matter is taken up on 27.07.2026, the petitioner and 2nd respondent were present. A Joint Compromise Memo dated 27.07.2026 was filed, wherein both parties have agreed to settle the claim for a sum of Rs.2,25,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and Twenty Five Thousand Only) as full and final settlement, without interest and the Joint Memo of Compromise is accepted by the claimant and 2nd Respondent. Since this court satisfied with the terms of compromise entered into between the parties with their oral enquiry, this memo of compromise is recorded accordingly. In view of the compromise, a compromise award is passed in favour of the petitioner for a sum of Rs.2,25,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and Twenty Five Thousand Only).

4. Conclusion:

In the result, the petitioner is awarded a sum of Rs.2,25,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and Twenty Five Thousand Only) as compensation payable by the **2nd respondent** for the injuries sustained by him (petitioner). The 2nd respondent is hereby directed to transfer the award amount of **Rs.2,25,000/- to the credit of petitioner as detailed below, directly through NEFT/RTGS mode**, within 06 weeks as agreed.

Only in the event of the electronic transfer is returned, reversed, or remains unsuccessful on account of the bank account is being **inoperative, closed, incorrect, or for any other reason attributable to the Petitioner**, the respondent Insurance Company shall intimate this Tribunal along with proof, if any, and the concerned petitioner. The petitioners shall furnish **correct and operative bank account particulars** before this tribunal within **two weeks** from the date of such intimation, and the respondent Insurance Company shall **re-transfer the amount to the correct bank account** within the time fixed by this tribunal. Any delay attributable to such incorrect or inoperative account particulars shall not render the respondent Insurance Company liable for

additional interest for the period of such delay. In case of failure to deposit the award amount within the stipulated time, the 2nd respondent shall further pay the petitioner interest at the rate of 7.5% per annum from the date of award till the date of its actual deposit. Based on the joint compromise memo and in the terms mentioned above the claim petition is disposed off. No costs.
