Neha Gupta Versus M/s R.G. Furnishings and another

Present: Shri Praveen Kumar, Advocate for the plaintiff.

File has been taken up today on an application moved on behalf of the plaintiff seeking withdrawal of the present suit with liberty to present the matter before the Court having competent pecuniary jurisdiction and for return of the original documents.

Learned counsel for the plaintiff has made the following statement:

“Stated that due to some technical defect, I want to withdraw the present suit and liberty may kindly be granted to file a fresh suit to competent court of jurisdiction and original documents may kindly be returned.”

Heard. Record perused.

The application proceeds on the specific ground that, upon examination of the pleadings, valuation of the suit and the applicable provisions governing pecuniary jurisdiction of Commercial Courts, the plaintiff has realised that the specified value of the present commercial dispute falls within the pecuniary jurisdiction of the Court of learned Civil Judge (Commercial Court), Gurugram, and not within the pecuniary jurisdiction of this Court. The plaintiff, therefore, seeks to pursue the same cause before the Court competent to entertain it.

Accordingly, having regard to the ground on which the present application has been moved and the valuation disclosed in the plaint, the plaint is ordered to be returned to the plaintiff under Order VII Rule 10 CPC for presentation before the Court of competent pecuniary jurisdiction, in accordance with law.

The requisite endorsement in terms of Order VII Rule 10(2) CPC, specifying the date of presentation of the plaint, the date of its return, the name of the person presenting it and brief reasons for its return, be made on the plaint before it is returned.

The original documents filed with the plaint shall also be returned to the plaintiff/authorised counsel against proper acknowledgment and identification, after retaining copies thereof on the record wherever required in accordance with the applicable rules.

It is clarified that this Court has expressed no opinion whatsoever on the merits of the claims raised in the plaint, and all rights and contentions of the parties shall remain open for consideration by the Court before which the plaint is presented.

The application stands disposed of accordingly.

Necessary compliance be made by the office. After return of the plaint and completion of the requisite formalities, the file pertaining to the proceedings before this Court be consigned to the record room. Necessary entry be made on CIS.
