ORDER:

1. Heard on bail application filed by applicant/accused Amandeep Singh under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS) for grant of regular bail praying that he has been falsely implicated in the present FIR and no recovery was effected from him. Notice of bail application was given to Ld. Addl. PP and record was summoned where upon HC Kuldeep Singh, No. 741/SAS Nagar has brought the record as per which on 16.06.2025 from main highway of village Dappar applicant Amandeep Singh alongwith his co-accused

Surinder Kumar Yadav and Raj Kumar Yadav were coming in the car bearing No. PB-65-DC-9996 make Verna Car and from the car which was driven by accused Amandeep Singh and Surinder Kumar Yadav being co-passenger, 2kg. opium was recovered which was taken into possession by the IO SI Amandeep Singh.

2. Whatever recovery in the present case i.e. 2kg. opium was effected on 16.06.2025 from accused/applicant and he is in custody since 16.06.2025. FSL report of the alleged contraband recovered in the present FIR from applicant/accused is yet to be received. The recovery from the car of accused/applicant ***Amandeep Singh*** falls within intermediate quantity i.e. under non commercial quantity. No other FIR has been registered against the applicant/accused as per the record put up by the Investigation officer. Completion of investigation and conclusion of trial will take considerable time. Hence, no useful purpose would be served by continued detention of applicant-accused in custody and such detention is an avoidable burden on the state exchequer. Accordingly, the instant bail application stands **allowed** and applicant-accused ***Amandeep Singh*** is admitted to bail on his furnishing bail bonds/ surety bonds in sum of ₹ 50,000/- with one surety of the like amount, to the satisfaction of the concerned Illaqa/Duty Magistrate, subject to the conditions that :

1. That the applicant(s) shall attend the court on every date of hearing.
2. That the applicant(s) shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused.

3. That the applicant(s) shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer and shall not tamper with the evidence in the matter.
4. That the applicant(s) shall not leave the country without prior permission of the court.

4. However, any observation while disposing the present bail application will not effect the merit of the trial. Copy of order be sent to Illaqa Magistrate/Duty Magistrate for necessary compliance. Necessary intimation regarding decision of the bail application be also sent to accused/applicant through Superintendent jail. Copy of order be placed on remand paper/court file and file of bail application be consigned to the record room as per rules.
