Order:-

1. The applicants/accused Gagandeep Singh, Balbir Singh and Daler Singh have moved this application for the grant of bail to him in view of the

provisions of Section 438 Cr.P.C. In application it has been alleged that he has been falsely implicated in this case. They have committed no offence as alleged by the prosecution. So, ultimate plea is that they be granted the concession of anticipatory bail.

2. On the other hand, learned APP for the State submitted that the allegations levelled against the applicants are serious in nature. Their ultimate plea is that concession of bail may not be granted to the applicants/accused.

3. I have heard the respective submissions of both sides and gone through the record on file.

4. The applicants/accused in pursuance to the order dated 27.09.2018 has already joined the investigation and they were granted the concession of interim bail at that time. Today, ASI Malkeet Singh made statement that the applicants/accused have joined the investigation in this case and he is no more required for custodial interrogation. So, there is no denying the fact that the applicants have already joined the investigation. The parties have rival contentions. The criminal liability of the accused/applicants would be assessed accordingly on completion of the investigation and when police would furnish the report. Moreover, the parties have to prove their own case by leading their own evidence in support of their averments. There appears to

be nothing substantive on record at this stage to decline the concession of anticipatory bail to the applicants/accused especially when at this stage the police has not put forth any such circumstance which is contrary. So, applying these considerations and keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, the application having been moved by the applicants/accused seeking the grant of anticipatory bail is allowed and interim bail granted to the applicants/accused as per order dated 29.09.2018 is, hereby, made absolute subject to the condition as enumerated under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. with further stipulation that applicants/accused shall facilitate the investigation as and when required by the investigation officer to do so. The application stands disposed of without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case. File be consigned to record-room.
