CALLED BEFORE DAILY LOK-ADALATH

Petitioner no.1 to 3, Learned counsel for petitioners and counsel for respondent insurance company are present.

2. Both the counsel have filed joint memo along with the copies of Aadhaar cards (originals are returned) of the petitioners.

3. Perused the Joint memo. As per the compromise the petitioner and the respondent insurance company have compromised this case for **Rs.28,50,000/-**.

4. The parties present before the board submit that they have no objection to pass the award as per the settlement and settlement is voluntarily and there is no force or threat on them.

5. Since the compromise is voluntarily and is in accordance with law, the compromise between the parties is accepted. Hence, this board proceeds to pass the following:-

ORDER

Joint memo filed by both the parties is hereby accepted and thereby, petition filed by the petitioner is allowed as per the terms of joint memo.

2. The Respondent Insurance company is hereby directed to deposit the amount of **Rs.28,50,000/- (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakh Fifty thousand only)** before this Tribunal within **two months**, from the date of this order.

3. Petitioner no.1 and 2 are entitled for Rs.14,00,000/- each and petitioner no.3 is entitled for Rs.50,000/- out of award amount.

4. After deposit of amount, office is directed to release/credit 75% of award amount in favor of petitioner no.1 and 2 and release entire share of petitioner no.3 through e-payment in accordance with law. Further, remaining 25% share of petitioner no.1 and 2 shall be kept in deposit for a period of 3 years in the name of petitioner no.1 and 2 in any nationalized or scheduled bank.

5. Draw award accordingly.
