Cross examination by dvocate for Respondent no.2:-

Initially the petitioner took treatment in Govt hospital, Narasapura. Thereafter in SNR hospital, Kolar, later he came to our hospital. Petitioner took first aid treatment in SNR hospital. I have not issued any wound certificate. It is false to suggest that as per wound certificate, the petitioner was suffering only pain. It is false to suggest that there is difference between the injury sustained by the petitioner stated in the wound certificate and the injury which I have stated in my chief affidavit.

2. It is true to suggest that at the time of discharge, the petitioner was in stable condition. We have mentioned the difficulties of the petitioner in Ex.P-13 and other documents of follow up records as well. The petitioner is a known case of hyper tension on treatment. I have not produced recent x-ray report.

3. Fracture is united. It is false to suggest that there is no fracture in the hip. During the physiotherapy, there is improvement in the muscle power. The treatment is over and he needs to undergo surgery for removal of implants. It is true to suggest that as age advances the difficulties would arise. It is false to suggest that I have assessed lower limb disability at 45% on the higher side.

4. It is false to suggest that the petitioner is a normal and aged about 67 years, therefore the question of disability does not arise. It is false to suggest that I deposed falsehood regarding estimation of future medical expenses of Rs.60,000/-. It is false to suggest that I deposed falsehood regarding difficulties faced by the petitioner. It is false to suggest that though the petitioner did not undergo any follow up treatment, in order to help the petitioner, I have got created the follow up records. It is false to suggest that in order to help the petitioner, I am deposing falsehood before this court by filing this false affidavit.
