

L/Counsel for plaintiff is present. Heard on IA.No.I filed U/o 39 Rule 1 and 2 of CPC, seeking ad-interim temporary injunction restraining the defendants No.1, 4, 5 and 7 from alienating the suit properties, till disposal of the suit.

Perused IA.No.I, affidavit and the documents. It is a suit filed by the plaintiff against the defendants seeking partition and separate possession of suit properties. Plaintiff claims that she is the daughter of defendant No.1 and 2. Defendant No.3 to 6 are her siblings. She and defendant No.1 to 6 constitute a Hindu Joint Family and suit properties are

her joint family ancestral properties. Out of the suit properties, during 2013 suit land Sy.No.86/3, measuring 32 guntas was alienated behind her back in favour of defendant No.7. Now, defendants are making hectic efforts to alienate the suit lands. The suit land bearing Sy.No.86/3, measuring 6 guntas is standing in the

name of defendant No.1. Suit land bearing Sy.No.86/4, measuring 32 guntas is jointly standing in the names of defendant No.4 and 5. Considering the same, if prior notice is issued to the other side, very purpose of filing IA would be defeated by delay. At this stage, plaintiff has made out ground to grant ex-parte TI order as prayed in IA.No.I. Hence, proceed to pass the following:

:: ORDER::

Ex-parte temporary injunction order restraining the defendant No.1, 4 and 5 from alienating the suit properties bearing Sy.No.86/3, measuring 6 guntas, standing in the name of defendant No.1 and Sy.No.86/4, measuring 32 guntas, standing in the names of defendant No.4 and 5, as prayed in IA.No.I, is granted until further order.

This order shall take effect only upon compliance of Order 39 Rule 3 (a) of CPC.

Issue notice of IA. No.I, copy of this order to defendant No.1, 4, 5 and 7. Issue

suit summons to the defendants No.1 to
