ORDER

This is an application for grant of anticipatory bail by Suresh Rajaram Thorat and six others under the apprehension of filing of offence against them, seeking protection from arrest.

2. Court perused the application and reply filed by Kasturba Marg police station. Heard Ld. Adv Sarjerao Patil for the applicants/accused and Ld. APP Smt. Shilpa Mahatekar for The State.

3. It is not the thing that at least the wife of Suresh has given the report to police station, but police report shows that no any such report/complaint is received. Thus, there is no apprehension at all to the applicants/accused to be arrested. For getting the anticipatory bail there should be 'reasonable apprehension'. Here, the question of

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reasonable apprehension does not arise, when no any such application/report is moved to the police station. Therefore, application is without merits. It is rejected with liberty to file at appropriate stage.
