Both the parties filed compromise petition U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC and submitted that they have compromised the above suit in terms of the compromise petition.

The terms mentioned in the compromise petition are made known to both the parties and both the parties admitted the same to be true and correct and submitted that they have voluntarily agreed and compromised the suit.

Both the parties have furnished their photostat copies of Aadhar identity card.

Heard, perused and on perusal the above suit is filed by the plaintiff against the defendants seeking the relief of Declaration and permanent injunction.

The plaintiff has furnished the RTC extract pertaining to suit properties and they are standing in the name of plaintiff and defendant No.1 to 3 jointly.
