Both the parties and their counsels are present and filed joint memo and compromise petition U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC along with Adhar card xerox and stating that both parties have amicably settled the dispute as per condition mentioned in the compromise petition. Hence, prayed to accept the compromise petition and dispose off in terms of compromise petition.

Perused the compromise petition the above suit filed seeking the relief of partition and separate possession.

The both parties and their counsels have duly signed. There is no minors in the present suit.

Contents of the compromise petition read over to the parties in the language known by them which is their mother tongue. They have understood the contents of the same. This court is of opinion that the parties have compromised the matter on their own will.

There is no factual and legal inhibition to accept the compromise. Hence, I pass the following;

ORDER

Compromise petition filed U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC is hereby accepted. Suit is decreed in terms of compromise petition.

Compromise petition, joint memo are part and parcel of the decree.

The order/decreed passed today under compromise petition is only to the parties of this suit. It will not affect other persons if they have any right over the suit property.
