This petition is coming on this day for hearing before this court in the presence of Tr. M. Kandasamy, Advocate for the petitioner and Tr. S. Suresh Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/complainant and upon hearing both sides, this Court passed the following :

ORDER

1. This Petition is filed by the accused u/s 480 BNSS seeking bail.

2. The learned counsel for the Petitioner/Accused has submitted that, the first bail application was dismissed on 23.07.2026 in Crmp No.1119/2026, this petitioner has filed a bail petition before the Hon'ble Principal sessions Judge, Tenkasi in Crmp No.2798/2026 and the same was dismissed on 10.08.2026 with the liberty to file fresh petition before the trial court, the accused is innocent and he has not committed any such offence and there is no such occurrence was happened as per complainant case, accused is falsely impleaded in this case, the accused further submits that he is ready to cooperate with the trial and other proceedings, if they are not enlarged on bail, his family may be put into irreparable loss and injuries, the accused further submits that he is ready to furnish sufficient sureties and

comply with any condition that may be imposed by this court and prays to enlarge him on bail.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor strongly objected and filed counter stating that the accused was arrested pursuant to the warrant executed on 17.06.2026 and is presently in judicial custody as an under-trial prisoner, pursuant to the orders of this Court. Further, if bail is granted to the accused, there is a strong likelihood that he may not cooperate with the trial proceedings and may abscond to another State, thereby evading the process of law and prays to dismiss the petition.

4. After hearing both sides, this court has perused all the documents. On 27.04.2026 NBW was issued against the petitioner/accused for his non appearance and he was arrested on 17.06.2026 and remanded him to judicial custody. In earlier occasions also he has absconded for a long time. Now the case is at the stage of conclusion of trial. Considering the nature of the case and the fact that if he is released on bail there is every possibility for him to abscond and it will cause hindrance to the proceedings of the case, at this stage, this court is not inclined to allow this Petition.

5. Finally, this petition is dismissed.
