ORDER

Matter referred to Lok-Adalat. Plaintiffs and defendant and their counsel are present. The counsel for the plaintiff has filed application U/o 32 Rule 7 of CPC seeking permission to compromise the matter by the next friend of the plaintiff No.2 on behalf of minor plaintiff No.3 and 4, plaintiff No.5 on behalf of the plaintiff No.6 and 7. Since, the Advocate also filed certificate that, the said compromise is for the benefit of the minors also. Hence, application is allowed. As the suit is one for partition and separate possession, the same was referred to Lok-Adalat. After conciliation, the parties have agreed to settle the matter amicably. Accordingly, they have filed joint compromise petition. The plaintiffs and defendant are read over and explained the terms of the compromise and both submit that, they have settled accordingly and the compromise petition may be accepted. As the compromise reached at appears to be voluntary and not opposed to any public policy, the same is accepted. The suit is disposed off as settled at Lok-Adalat as per the terms of the joint compromise petition. Draw a decree accordingly. The compromise petition is part and parcel of the decree.
