**ORDER ON I.A No.XII**

The plaintiffs have filed the application under Order VII Rule 14 R/w Section 151 of CPC seeking permission to produce documents.

2. In the affidavit annexed to the application, the plaintiff No.1 himself and on behalf of plaintiff No.2 submits that, he was unable to produce the documents sought to be produced earlier, as he was not available to his counsel in time. The plaintiff No.1 contends that the said document is relevant and piece of his evidence which is very essential for adjudicating the matter in dispute and without it, the case cannot be properly decided. It is further submitted that no loss or prejudice will cause to the other side if the application is allowed, they will be put to heavy and irreparable loss which cannot be compensated in terms of money. Hence prayed to allow the application.

3. Defendants have appeared through their respective counsels but not filed their objections to the application.

4. On the basis of the rival contentions the following points arise for determination:-

6. **Point No.1:-** That plaintiffs have filed this suit for declaration and injunction.

7. The Court is of the view that both parties must be afforded a fair and reasonable opportunity to present their respective cases. No party should suffer injustice on account of procedural technicalities. The plaintiffs seeks permission to produce certain documents in support of their case. If permission is granted, the defendants shall have the opportunity to cross-examine the plaintiffs with reference to the said documents. In my considered opinion, the plaintiff has made out sufficient grounds to allow him to produce the said documents. Hence, point No.1 is answered in the '**Affirmative**'.

8. **Point No.2:-** In view of the discussion and conclusion this court proceed to pass the following:-

**: ORDER :**

The application filed by the plaintiffs under Order VII Rule 14 R/w Section 151 of CPC is allowed with cost of Rs.200/-.

Plaintiffs are permitted to produce  
the documents mentioned in the list.
