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ORDER

Petitioner has filed the instant petition U/Sec.482 of Barathiya Nagarika Suraksha Sanhitha, 2023 seeking anticipatory bail in case of his arrest in connection with Crime No.96/2026 of Dobbespets Police Station, for the offences punishable U/Sec. 306 of BNS.

2. The learned Public Prosecutor has filed objections.
3. Heard the arguments on both side and perused record.
4. The Points for consideration are:
 1. Whether the petitioner is entitle for anticipatory bail?
 2. What order?
5. My findings on the above points are as under:

Point No.1: In the affirmative,

REASONS

6. **Point No.1:-** In the complaint annexed to the FIR in Crime No. 96/2026 registered by the SHO of Dobbespets police

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station, it is stated that the defacto complainant is the Team Leader of Maintenance and Facilities of K.K. Group India Private Limited. In the month of May 2026 when he watched the footages of CCTV installed in the company and checked the stock, he noticed that in between 01.04.2026 and 13.05.2026 some of the employees working in the company committed theft of vaccume machine, Camera, Clamp meter, Battery Operated Drilling machine, Industrial Fan, Copper Cable and Copper wire scrap worth of more than Rs.4,00,000/-. In the complaint it is stated that he would have suspicion on four employees of the company namely Shivakumar T.N, Chandra Mohan, Gagan M and Anil Kumar. On the basis of the said complaint the SHO of Dobbespeth police station registered FIR against four accused persons for the offence punishable under Section 306 of BNS.

7. In the FIR, the petitioner is shown as accused No.3. Apprehending arrest in the said case, he filed the instant petition seeking anticipatory bail.

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8. In the report annexed to the objections it is stated that accused No.1 Chandra Mohan admitting committing of theft shown the stolen properties which he and other accused sold to the scrap vendor and on the basis of the information given by him, the stolen properties were seized and reported under PF No.48/2026. In the report of the Investigation Officer it is also stated that the car used by the accused to transport the stole goods was also seized. Therefore nothing is left to be seize to complete the investigation.
9. The petitioner/accused No.3 is aged about 36 years. He is resident of the address as shown in the cause title. There is no criminal antecedents against him. In view of stolen properties were seized, the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not required for discovery or seizure to complete the investigation. When such is the case, I am of the opinion that anticipatory bail can be granted to the petitioner by imposing reasonable conditions to safeguard the apprehensions raised by the prosecution.

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In view of the above, I answer point No.1 in the affirmative.

10. **Point No.2:** For the reasons stated above, I pass the following:

ORDER

The petition filed by the petitioner under section 482 of BNSS is allowed.

The petitioner/accused No.3 is ordered to be released on bail in the event of his arrest in connection with Crime No.96/2026 of Dobbespeth police station for the offence punishable U/Sec. 306 of BNS by taking bond in a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- with a surety of like sum subject to the following conditions:

1. The petitioner shall appear before the SHO of respondent Police Station or Investigating Officer within 15 days from the date of this order.
2. He shall also appear before the Investigating Officer whenever called upon to appear by giving notice in writing well in advance fixing the date and time of appearance and co-operate with the investigation.
3. He shall furnish documents relating to him

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and his surety's residence and photo of their houses sufficient to easily locate in the locality and file affidavit stating in what capacity, they are residing therein with QR code of the location of the residents both present and permanent.

4. He shall not change his residence without prior intimation to the court.

5. He shall provide his contact number to the Investigation Officer and shall not change the contact number without prior intimation to the court.

6. He shall submit affidavits about his and his sureties occupations, occupational addresses with supporting documents.
