

Petitioner Counsel files memo with endorsement with regard to service of notice to the respondent.

No representation on behalf of respondent though notice duly served on respondent, therefore proceeded further as respondent ex-parte/absent and matter set down for enquiry.

Petitioner examined as PW1 and documents marked as Ex.P-1 and 2.

Heard by petitioner counsel and perused the record.

Petitioner was said to have born on 01.01.1979, but his birth information not provided to the respondent due to inadvertently by his parents. Hence, the respondent issued non-availability certificate as he does not register the date of birth of petitioner in the concerned record. Ex.P2/Aadhar card goes to show that the petitioner was born on 01.01.1979. The said evidence does not challenged by respondent as he/she exparte. In the circumstance, no reason to

disbelieve the oral and documentary evidence of PW1 and from the said evidence this court opines that petitioner proved that he was born on 01.01.1979 in the address as mentioned in the petition. Therefore, present petition filed by the petitioner U/s.13 (3) of Registration of Births and Deaths Act is hereby allowed and the respondent is hereby directed to register date of birth of petitioner as he born on 01.01.1979 along with other details as mentioned in the petition in the concerned register and issue birth certificate thereof by receiving prescribed fee if any.
