ISSUES

- 1) Whether the plaintiffs prove that they are the members of Hindu undivided joint family and the suit schedule properties are their joint family properties?
- 2) Whether the plaintiffs prove that they are entitled for Partition and Separate Possession of 1/7th share each in the item No.1, 2 and 3 of the suit properties?
- 3) Whether the plaintiffs prove that the sale deeds dated 18-07-1988, 24-02-1995, 17-06-1996, 16-10-1995, 20-12-1996, 11-03-1999 and 01-03-1999 are not binding on them?
- 4) Whether the defendant No.8 proves that this suit is not maintainable in view of Sec.6 of Hindu Succession Act (amended) of 2005?
- 5) Whether the defendant No.8 proves that she is the bona-fide purchaser and absolute owner of item No.2 of the suit schedule property through registered sale deed dated 24-02-1995?

- 6) Whether the defendant No.9 and 10 proves that the defendant No.1 to 5 executed sale deed with respect of item No.3 on 17-06-1996, hence this suit is not maintainable as per the provisions of Hindu Succession Act?
- 7) Whether the defendant 9 and 10 prove that the defendant No.10 is the bond-fide purchaser of item No.3 of the suit schedule properties?
- 8) Whether the defendants No.8 to 10 prove that suit is barred by law of limitation?
- 9) Whether the defendants No.8 to 10 prove that the suit is not properly valued and court fee paid is insufficient?
- 10) Whether defendant No.9 and 10 prove that plaintiffs have not sought any relief with respect of item No.4 to 7, hence there is no cause of action to file this suit?
- 11) Whether the plaintiffs are entitled for the relief as sought for?
- 12) What order or decree?
