: ORDERS ON COMPROMISE PETITION UNDER ORDER 23 RULE 3 OF CPC Plaintiff and defendants and their respective counsels Sri. M.G., Sri. M.K.M. and Sri. R.M.K. are present and filed Compromise petition U/O XXIII Rule 3 of CPC. Heard and perused plaint and compromise petition averments and documents. The terms and conditions incorporated in the compromise petition is read over and explained to the parties individually. Both the parties have admitted the execution of compromise petition, its terms and conditions and their signatures on it. Further they have submitted that they entered into compromise out of their own free will, voluntarily without any fear, force or undue influence. The parties identified their counsels vice versa the advocates identified the parties and their signatures. Both parties produced Aadhar Cards for their identity proof. The said compromise is not opposed to any law, for the time being in force. Since the parties entered in to compromise voluntarily and the same is not opposed to any law, there is no reason to reject the same. Accordingly in the interest of justice, the compromise petition is hereby accepted. In view of the compromise, we proceeds to pass the following: O R D E R The Compromise petition filed by the plaintiff and defendants U/O XXIII Rule 3 of CPC., is hereby allowed. The Suit filed by the plaintiff is hereby decreed as per the compromise petition. Compromise petition shall form part and parcel of the compromise decree. In view of compromise office is hereby directed to refund the Court Fee in favour of plaintiff as per the law. Draw decree accordingly.
