This Petition taken on filing and coming before me for final hearing on today 10.08.2026. The Assistant Public Prosecutor Grade-I for the respondent / complainant and Advocate Mr.A.Aashik Ali, B.A., LLB., for the Petitioner/Accused after hearing both sides and on perusal of case records, this court delivers the following

ORDER

1. Heard. Records perused.
2. On perusal of the records, it is seen that the petitioner/accused was remanded to judicial custody on 11.06.2026 connection with Crime No.44 of 2026 for the offence punishable Under section 137(2), 311 of BNS. The petitioner has been in judicial custody for the past 60 days. The FIR index has been verified and online, it is found that the charge sheet has not yet filed before this court. The

right of statutory bail U/s.187(3)(ii) of BNSS was explained to the accused. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and the incarceration of the accused for the past 60 days, this court finds that the accused is entitled to be released on statutory bail/Mandatory bail, as the charge sheet has not been filed within the prescribed period (60 days). It is also noted that no bail has been granted earlier and that the accused continues to be in judicial custody. Hence, in view of the above, this court is inclined to grant statutory bail to the petitioner/accused. Accordingly, the petition is allowed on the following conditions.

i) The petitioner is directed to execute a bond for Rs.10,000/- with 2 sureties likes sum each to the value of Rs.10,000/- to the satisfaction of the court.

ii) The petitioner and the sureties are directed to produce their ID proof.

iii) The petitioner is directed to appear and sign before the respondent police daily at 10.00 Am., for the period of 15 days.

iv) The petitioner shall not commit any offences of similar nature the petitioner shall not abscond during investigation or trial of the case and the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness during investigation or trial.
