

Case called out.
Plaintiff present.

Sri.HGG Advocate for plaintiffs present.

Defendant No.1 to 4 present.

Sri.HSK advocate for defendant No.1 to 4 present.

Both the parties have filed Joint Compromise Petition under Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC and produces copies of I D proofs of the parties.

The original ID of parties secured and compared. The identity of parties found to be true. Originals returned back to the parties.

Further, the contents of the compromise petition are read-over to the parties in the language known to them. They have agreed with the terms of the compromise petition. They further declare that they have voluntarily entered into compromise out of their own volition.

Both the parties admit contents of Compromise Petition.

Defendant No.1 acknowledges for having received sum of Rs.50,000/- from plaintiff and defendant No.2 for having relinquished her right in the suit schedule properties in their favour.

Heard both side counsel. Accordingly this Court proceed to pass the following:

Orders on Compromise Petition

Perused the compromise petition. In view of the terms of the compromise petition, there is no impediment for this Court to allow the same. This Court has ascertained the voluntariness of both the parties before accepting the compromise petition. The compromise entered and the terms agreed by the parties are found to be lawful.

Accordingly, The compromise petition filed by both the parties under Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC is accepted and it is hereby allowed.

The Suit is decreed in terms of the Compromise Petition. The terms of compromise petition shall form part of the Decree.

Draw Final Decree accordingly.
