This petition has come before me on 10.07.2026 for final hearing in the presence of **Sri P. Suryachandra Rao**, Advocate for Petitioners and the Respondent Nil, upon perusing the material available on record and the matter having stood over for consideration till this day, this Court delivers the following :

ORDER

This petition is filed by the petitioners 1 and 2 under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 to pass a decree of divorce by mutual consent, dissolving the marriage of the petitioners solemnized on 20.12.2023.

2. The averments of the petition in brief are that :

a) The Petitioners are the husband and wife and their marriage was performed on 20.12.2023 at Appanna Plaza, Narasapuram as per Hindu rites and caste customs. Their marriage was consummated. At the time of marriage, the 1st petitioner is working in United Kingdom and on that contest

only, the parents of the 2nd petitioner performed the marriage. After the marriage, the petitioners lived together for 20 days and during that period they went to honey moon to Thailand where they were not lived happily due to their differences of ideologies. Both the petitioners are well educated and they are having their own ideologies and since January, 2024 they are living separately. Recently, the 1st petitioner returned from United Kingdom and the elders of the petitioners insisted the 1st petitioner to take back the 2nd petitioner to United Kingdom, but both the petitioners are not interested to live together and both side elders tried their level best to settle them but the petitioners did not shown any interest. Due to mis-understandings between them and such issues are not in a position to resolve the same amicably. The petitioners bluntly stating that they do not want to continue the marital life. Both the petitioners openly started that they are not having any love and affection towards each other and they do not want to continue the marital life in future. The 1st petitioner agreed to give an amount of Rs.12,00,000/- to the 2nd petitioner towards her life as a permanent maintenance and of that amount Rs.6,00,000/- is agreed to be given at the time of filing of the petitioner by way of demand draft bearing No.501305 drawn on ICICI Bank, Vijayawada in the name of 2nd petitioner and remaining Rs.6,00,000/- to be paid by the 1st petitioner to 2nd petitioner at the time of giving their evidence. Beside that they are not claiming anything from each other. There is no possibility of their reunion. Accordingly, both the petitioners mutually agreed to dissolve their marriage by decree of divorce. Hence, the petition.

3. Heard the counsel for petitioners.

4. **The point for consideration is :**

Whether the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce by mutual consent, dissolving the marriage of the petitioners 1 and 2 was solemnized on 20.12.2023 ?

5. **POINT:**

To prove the claim of the petitioners, the petitioners 1 and 2 got examined themselves as P.Ws.1 and 2 respectively and got exhibited Ex.P-1 to Ex.P-4 documents. Ex.P-1 is Wedding card, dt.20.12.2023 of petitioners 1 and 2, Ex.P-2 is Marriage photo of the petitioners 1 and 2, Ex.P-3 is Photostat copy of Aadhar card of 1st petitioner (compared with original) and Ex.P-4 is Photostat copy of Aadhar card of 2nd petitioner (compared with original).

6. Petitioners 1 and 2 filed their chief-examination affidavits as P.W.1 and 2 respectively and Exs.P-1 to Ex.P-4 are exhibited through P.W.1. P.W.1 and P.W.2 reiterated the petition averments in their chief-examination affidavits. As per the averments of petition and the evidence of P.Ws.1 and 2, both the petitioners have been living separately since January, 2024. Due to misunderstandings between them and such issues are not in a position to resolve the same amicably. The petitioners bluntly stating that they do not want to continue the marital life and they do not want to continue the marital life in future. The 1st petitioner agreed to give an amount of Rs.12,00,000/- to the 2nd petitioner towards her life as a permanent maintenance and of that amount Rs.6,00,000/- is agreed to be given at the time of filing of the petitioner by way of demand draft bearing No.501305 drawn on ICICI Bank, Vijayawada in the name of 2nd petitioner and remaining Rs.6,00,000/- paid by the 1st petitioner to 2nd petitioner by way of demand draft on 10.07.2026 bearing demand draft No.002398 drawn on Axis Bank, Kanuru, Vijayawada at the time of giving their evidence. Beside that they will not claim anything from each other in future. There is no possibility of their reunion. There is no collusion between the petitioners 1 and 2. Ex.P-1 is Wedding card, dt.20.12.2023 of petitioners 1 and 2, Ex.P-2 is Marriage photo of the petitioners 1 and 2, Ex.P-3 is Photostat copy of Aadhar card of 1st petitioner (compared with original) and Ex.P-4 is Photostat copy of Aadhar card of 2nd petitioner (compared with original). From the

averments of petition and evidences of P.W.1 and P.W.2 and Ex.P-1 to Ex.P-4, it is obvious that the petitioners 1 and 2 filed this petition with mutual consent and out of their own will and accord.

7. Thus, in the facts and circumstances of the case, in the light of the evidence let in and for the foregoing reasons, it is held that the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce by mutual consent, dissolving the marriage of the petitioners from the date of decree.

Accordingly, this point is answered.

In the result, the petition is allowed, granting decree of divorce by mutual consent under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, dissolving the marriage of the petitioners 1 and 2 solemnized on 20.12.2023, without costs.
