

4 CBI 27/2020 CBI Vs. ANIRUDH SINGH RC SI0005 /2020 ()

Present: Mr. Amit Jindal, Ld. PP for CBI.
A1 Anirudh Singh and A2 Jitendra Kumar along with Sh. Anand Srivastav, Ld. Counsel for both the accused persons.

Submissions heard on the aspect of charge. There is *prima facie* case against both the accused for offences punishable under Section 120-B r/w Sections 419 and 420/511 IPC.

Charges framed against accused No.1 under Section 120-B r/w Sections 419 and 420/511 IPC and charges framed against accused No.2 under Section 120-B r/w 419/420/511 IPC, to which both the accused pleaded guilty and did not claim trial. The consequences of plea of guilt have been explained to the accused persons, but they have reiterated the plea of guilt, stating that they are making the same voluntarily, after fully understanding the implications thereof. Their plea of guilt has been recorded.

Considering the totality of circumstances and the plea of guilt advanced by the accused persons, **accused No.1 Anirudh Singh stands convicted of the offence under Section 120-B r/w Sections 419 and 420/511 IPC and accused No.2 Jitender Kumar stands convicted of the offence under Section 120-B r/w 419/420/511 IPC.**

ORDER ON SENTENCE

Submissions heard on the quantum of sentence.

Ld. APP for the state has submitted that the convicts be sentenced as per law. *Per contra*, Ld. Counsel for the convicts has

prayed for a lenient view on the ground, that convict No.1 has already been in custody for a period of 21 days and convict No.2 only had an ancillary role to play. It is further submitted that no wrongful loss or wrongful gain has been caused to any person, on account of the offences committed by the convicts and the same be also considered, while awarding the sentence.

Heard. Perused. Considered.

Keeping in view the totality of circumstances, **convict No.1 Anirudh Singh is sentenced to imprisonment for the period already undergone by him and a fine of Rs.10,000/- for the offences punishable under Section 120-B r/w Sections 419 and 420/511 IPC. Further, convict No.2 Jitender Kumar is sentenced to imprisonment, till the rising of the Court and a fine of Rs.5,000/- for the offences punishable under Section 120-B r/w Sections 419 and 420/511 IPC.**

Fine paid. Receipt be issued.

Copy of this judgment be given to both the convicts and prosecution free of cost.

Bail bonds/surety bonds along with endoresments thereof, shall stand cancelled.

As nothing survives in the present case, file be consigned to record room after due compliance.
