Vide separate order on sentence, Convict No.2
Bhupender Kumar is sentenced to rigorous imprisonment for a

period of one year and with fine for an amount of Rs.50,000/-, in default of payment of fine, further simple imprisonment for a period of six months for the offence punishable u/S 420 IPC r/w Section 120B IPC and simple imprisonment for a period of one year and with fine for an amount of Rs.50,000/-, in default of payment of fine, further simple imprisonment for a period of six months for the offence u/S 13 (1) (d) r/w Section 13 (2) of PC Act (unamended). Both the punishments shall run concurrently. However, the fine shall be payable separately for both the offences. Benefit u/S 428 CrPC, if any, be also extended to him.

Further, Convict No.3 Ravinder Sharma, Convict No.4 Rajeev Kumar, Convict No.5 Pradeep Puri, Convict No.7 Amit Tanwar, Convict No.8 Ashish Kumar Sharma & Convict No.9 Ashish Mittal are all sentenced to rigorous imprisonment for a period of one year and with fine for an amount of Rs.50,000/-, in default of payment of fine, further simple imprisonment for a period of six months for the offence punishable u/S 420 IPC r/w Section 120B IPC. Benefit u/S 428 CrPC be also granted to the convicts, if applicable.

Fine not deposited.

At this stage, Ld. Counsels for convicts have separately moved applications u/S 430(3) BNSS (Section 389(3) of erstwhile CrPC) seeking bail till the date of filing of appeal as the convicts want to prefer appeal against the judgment of conviction and order on sentence.

Heard.

In view of the same, convicts are granted bail for 60

days or till the date of filing of appeal, whichever is earlier, subject to furnishing bail bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- each with one surety of like amount.

Bail bonds are furnished and accepted for 60 days or till the date of filing of appeal, whichever is earlier.

Copy of the order on sentence be supplied to all the convicts free of cost, against receiving.

File be consigned to record room after necessary compliance.
