The present application has been moved U/s 482 of BNSS seeking grant of interim bail for applicant/accused **Arman** for a period of 60 days on the ground of ill health of his mother and wife. Applicant was arrested in case FIR No-61/2025 on allegations of committing offence U/s 310(2)/317(3)/111/254/61(2)/238(b) of BNS at PS Karawal Nagar,

Ld. Counsel for the applicant/accused has submitted that similar application is neither pending nor has been recently dismissed by any higher court.

Reply filed today.

Submissions heard. Record has been perused.

The present application has been moved on the ground that mother of the applicant/accused is not keeping well. She is getting treatment from LNJP Hospital and Patel Chest Hospital. It is submitted that she is suffering from asthma and other old-age related diseases. The application further says that the wife of the applicant/accused also has also undergone a surgery of *appendix* recently. Although, the medical documents of the mother of the

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applicant/accused have not been verified from the Patel Chest Hospital.

Even if, it is accepted that the mother of the applicant/accused is suffering from *Asthama*, same is a chronic medical condition and there is no such emergency situation where the presence of the applicant/accused is required urgently. As far as the medical condition of the wife of the applicant/accused is concerned, she has already undergone a minor surgery for appendix.

This mechanism of interim bail has been devised to deal with the situations where an accused is facing serious allegations and is not entitled to regular bail but a situation of extreme emergency has arisen which warrants at least his interim bail.

Here in this case, there is no such medical condition with the wife and mother of the applicant/accused. Allegations against the applicant are serious in nature, and if, release on interim bail, he might abscond, tamper with the evidence or can influence the witnesses.

In view of the above, no ground is made out to release the applicant/accused on interim bail for a period of 60 days.

Accordingly, the application in hand stands **dismissed**.

Application stands disposed of.

Copy of this order be given dasti.

Ordered accordingly.
