ORDER

By this application the Applicant **Khalikunisa Rahis Shaikh**
has sought for grant of pre-arrest bail under Section 482 of Bhartiya

Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, (In short, “BNSS”), as she apprehends arrest by Nehru Nagar Police Station, Mumbai in C.R.No.466/2026, for the offences punishable under Sections 318 (4), 336 (2), 336 (3), 340 (2) of the Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita, (hereinafter, referred to as, “BNS”) read with Section 12 (1) (b) of Passport Act, 1967.

2. It is the case of prosecution that, during Passport verification applicant/accused was asked to submit documents i.e. Aadhar Card, Pand Card, Light Bill, Online Birth Certificate and other documents. The said documents were sent to Crime Branch-II on 21.04.2026. The Passport Authority had asked Nehru Nagar Police Station to verify the birth certificate of applicant/accused. During verification the birth certificate was found to be forged. On inquiry with accused, she submitted that, the said birth certificate came to be generated from special website, which was found to be unauthorized. Thus, police came to the conclusion that, accused submitted forged birth certificate, which she has submitted alongwith other documents to Passport Authority. Offence under Section 318 (4), 336 (2), 336 (3), 340 (2) of BNS Act r/w 12 (1) (b) of Passport Act vide crime No.466/2026 came to be registered against her. Accused is apprehending her arrest in the instant crime.

3. Heard both sides at length.

4. Concerned police station is in custody of birth certificate of accused, which is alleged to be forged document. The date of birth mentioned therein is similar to the date of birth mentioned in Aadhar Card and Pan Card of accused. Even the same date of birth is

mentioned in her official record. It is submitted by accused that, the birth certificate was generated by her advocate at U.P. on payment of necessary fees, which she has disclosed to police during inquiry. Prima-facie accused did not found to have generated her birth certificate alleged to have been forged. The website through which birth certificate came to be generated is alleged to be illegal. There is nothing on record to show that, accused had tamper with her date of birth to show her false birth date. Since, the false document is in custody of police, this Court is inclined to grant her anticipatory bail by imposing necessary conditions such as marking her presence to concern police station until charge-sheet is filed. Hence, I pass the following order :-

ORDER

1. The Anticipatory Bail Application No.1380/2026 is allowed.
2. In the event of arrest, the Applicant **Khalikunisa Rahis Shaikh** in C.R.No.466/2026 registered with Nehru Nagar Police Station, Mumbai for the offences punishable under Sections 318 (4), 336 (2), 336 (3), 340 (2) of the Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita, (hereinafter, referred to as, “BNS”) read with Section 12 (1) (b) of Passport Act, 1967, be released on bail of furnishing P. R. Bond to the extent of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand Only) with one or two sureties of the like amount.
3. The Applicant and her sureties shall provide their respective mobile numbers and email addresses and documents pertaining to place of residence and shall also intimate change in address and mobile no. if any, during the pendency of the matter.
4. The Applicant shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or pressurize any person

acquainted with the facts of the present case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court.

5. The Applicant shall attend the concerned police station on every Wednesday and Saturday between 11.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. noon for inquiry with police until charge-sheet is filed
6. Any breach of condition in the aforesaid order would amount to cancellation of pre-arrest bail forthwith.
7. The Applicant shall not leave Mumbai without prior permission of this Court.
8. The Observations made herein are prima-facie and shall not influence the trial on merits.
9. The Anticipatory Bail application No.1380/2026 stands disposed of accordingly.
