:: ORDER ::

The Concerned Revenue Authority has requested to refer the matter to Lok-Adalath as the offence U/sec.21(4) of M.M.Act is compoundable and Accused No.1 to 4 are ready to pay compound fee.

The learned APP has filed a petition U/sec.321 of Cr.P.C. to withdrawn the Sec.3 of PDPP Act and against the Accused No.1 to 4 the same is allowed as per the orders of this court vide Crl.M.P. No.423/2020, Dt.12-12-2020. Hence, this matter referred to Lok Adalath.

The alleged offence against the Accused No.1to 4 for transporting of sand without any valid permit, which attracts Sec.21(4) of Mines and Minerals Act and as per the Sec.23A of Mines and Minerals Act, the offence U/Sec.21(4) of Mines and Minerals Acts are compoundable in nature, as per G.O.Ms.No.15 of 2015 the owner has compounded the offence by paying compounding fee to the concerned authority. Hence, the case against Accused No.1 to 4 for the offence U/Sec.21(4) of Mines and Minerals Act is closed and the Accused is discharged. No case property seized by the police in this case.
