Ld counsel for Defendant files I.A. No. 3 U/o 32 Rule 7 of CPC seeking permission to enter compromise by the Defendant No. 1 on behalf of her minor Defendant No. 2. Perused the application annexed with affidavit, there are sufficient reasons to allow I.A. No. 3 and it is satisfied that the said compromise is for the benefit of minor Defendant No. 2. The Ld counsel for Defendants files certificate and submits that the compromise entered by the Defendant No. 1 on behalf of Defendant No. 2 is for the benefit of interest of her minor son.

Ld counsel for plaintiff files memo to dismiss the claim

against defendant No. 3. In view of memo the claim against the defendant No. 3 is hereby dismissed.

Both counsels and parties present and files compromise petition under Order XXIII Rule 3 of CPC, along with photo copies of Aadhaar cards of both sides and produced the original Aadhaar Cards for verification.

I have perused the contents of Compromise Petition and satisfied that terms and condition of this compromise are valid and by this compromise the entire dispute or rival claims of parties will be completely settled.

Besides I have read over the contents of the compromise petition to the parties in Kannada language and in turn they have accepted the terms and condition and also admitted the execution of compromise petition and state that they have voluntarily entered in to compromise and there is no coercion.

The terms of Compromise petition are lawful and there is no

impediment for this court to accept the compromise petition. Hence compromise petition is allowed.

ORDER

The suit is decreed as per the terms of compromise petition.

The terms of compromise petition shall form the part and parcel of the decree.

Draw decree accordingly.
