

:ORDERS ON MAIN PETITION:

1. The petitioner has filed this petition U/Sec.13(3) of the Registration of Births & Deaths Act, 1969, seeking for issuance of direction to the respondent to register the date of death of petitioner No.1 husband in the concerned records.
2. It is the case of petitioner No.1 that, petitioner No.1 husband by name Chandrappa S/o Basappa (ಚಂದ್ರಪ್ಪ ತಂದೆ ಬಸಪ್ಪ) is permanent resident of Uddagatta village, Jagaluru Taluk was died on 05.02.1982 at House. However, the petitioners due to ignorance, the entry of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband was not registered in the Register of Births and Deaths maintained by the respondent. As there was no entry of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband the respondent issued non-availability certificate/endorsement. Now, petitioners are in need of death certificate for the purpose of obtaining the varasu. Hence, this petition.
3. Though the notices were duly served upon the respondent. The respondent remained absent, hence he placed exparte.
4. The petitioner No.1 got examined as P.W.1 and got marked Ex.P-1 to P 5.
5. Heard argument and perused the entire records.
6. The following points would arise for my consideration:

Point No 1 : Whether the petitioner No.1 is entitled for relief sought in the petition?

Point No 2 : What Order?

7. For the above points my findings are as follows:

Point No.1 : In Affirmative.

8. **Point No.1:** The petitioners have filed this petition U/Sec.13(3) of the Registration of Births & Deaths Act, 1969 and petitioner No.1 husband by name Chandrappa S/o Basappa (ಚಂದ್ರಪ್ಪ ತಂದೆ ಬಸಪ್ಪ) is permanent resident of Uddagatta village, Jagaluru Taluk was died on 05.02.1982 at house. However, the petitioner No.1 due to ignorance, the entry of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband was not registered in the Register of Births and Deaths maintained by the respondent. However, due to ignorance, the entry of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband was not registered in the Register of Births and Deaths maintained by the respondent. As there was no entry of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband the respondent issued non-availability certificate/endorsement. Now, petitioner No.1 needed of death certificate of petitioner No.1 husband for the purpose of obtaining the heirship certificate. Hence, petitioners prayed to grant the relief claimed in the petition.

9. During the course of evidence, the petitioners have reiterated the averments made in the petition. Further the petitioner No.1 has furnished paper publication in a daily newspaper. In spite of paper publication non appeared and objected the petition. Hence, there are no impediment for issuing death certificate of Chandrappa S/o Basappa (ಚಂದ್ರಪ್ಪ ತಂದೆ ಬಸಪ್ಪ) favor of petitioner. As it is already stated that, the petitioner No.1 husband was died on 05.02.1982 at Uddagatta village, Jagaluru Taluk. But the same fact was not been informed to the concerned authorities. Non-informing the fact of date of death of petitioner No.1 husband is bonafide one. Hence prays for condoning the delay in informing the same and for issuance of directions to the respondent to register the date of death in concerned records. This fact is clear on perusal of Ex.P.1. The oral and documentary evidence of petitioners remained unchallenged. There is nothing on record to

disbelieve the case of petitioner. Considering all the above said aspects and all the materials on record, if the petition is allowed, no hardship will be caused to the other-side. Hence, I proceed to answer point No.1 in **Affirmative**.

10. **Point No.2:** Based on the above discussion, I proceed to pass the following.

:O R D E R:

The petition filed by the petitioner U/Sec.13(3) of the Registration of Births & Deaths Act, 1969 is hereby **allowed**.

The respondent is hereby directed to enter the date of death of petitioner No.1husband by name Chandrappa S/o Basappa (ಚಂದ್ರಪ್ಪ ತಂದೆ ಬಸಪ್ಪ) is permanent resident of Uddagatta village, Jagalur Taluk was died on 05.02.1982 in the register maintained by the respondent and after collecting prescribed fee, issue death Certificate to the petitioner.

It is needless to state that the said entry will not be conclusive evidence of the disputed date of death.
