

BA-1095-2020 Mandeep Singh etc. Vs. State of Punjab

Police record produced. Arguments heard. Learned counsel for applicants/accused has contended that the applicants/accused have been falsely implicated in the present case. The applicants/accused have no concern with the alleged occurrence whereas at the time of alleged occurrence, they were at their home. The offence under Section 452 of IPC is added in the present case just to make a non-bailable offence. The applicants/accused apprehend their arrest at the hands of police at any point of time. The applicants/accused are ready to join the investigation and are ready to abide by all the terms and conditions so imposed by this court and prayed that the applicants/accused may be granted anticipatory bail.

2. On the other hand, learned Addl. PP for the State has vehemently opposed the bail application on the ground of gravity of

offences and submitted that applicant/accused should not be granted concession of anticipatory bail and his bail application may be dismissed.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant/accused and learned Addl. P.P for the State and have also gone through the record on file.

4. The above-noted FIR against the applicants/accused Mandeep Singh and Baljeet Singh and 9 other persons by their names and 5/6 un-known persons has been registered at the instance of complainant of this case namely Jagtar Singh son of Sher Singh, resident of village Chak Punna Wali who have been alleged to have come to his Dhani on the date of occurrence i.e. 18.4.2020 at about 11 AM. They were allegedly armed with Dangs and Sotas and other weapons, while one of them namely Gurmukh Singh son of Dalip Singh, resident of Ladhuka Mandi was armed with Pistol. No injury whatsoever has been attributed to the applicant/accused no.2 Baljeet Singh while the simple allegation against applicant/accused no.1 Mandeep Singh is that he threw bricks towards Dalip Singh hitting him on his back. All the injuries either caused to the complainant or to his son Dalip Singh or to Gurdevan Bai fall within the ambit of

Sections 323/324 of IPC. As per record, co-accused Krishna Rani, Paramjit Kaur, Gurmukh Singh and Kishore Singh have already been granted pre-arrest bail by the court of Sh. S.S. Jossan, learned Addl. Sessions Judge, Fazilka as as such keeping in view the above-noted facts and circumstances of the case without commenting upon the merits thereof, in the interest of justice the applicants/accused ***Mandeep Singh and Baljeet Singh*** are admitted to interim bail subject to conditions that they will appear before the SHO/IO within 5 days from today and in the event of their arrest, they will also be released on bail on their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- each with one surety of the like amount each and subject to the conditions as envisaged in Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. Copy of this order be sent to SHO/IO of the police station concerned for information and necessary compliance. Police report be called for 17.6.2020.
