ORDER

The Petitioner has filed this petition U/sec.13(3) of Registration of Birth and Death Act 1969. alleging that, **she is her daughter & she was born on 17/03/2002.** As the petitioner family members were ignorant about the legal procedure of reporting and registering her date of birth before the competent authority. Further, the petitioner approached the respondent to get her birth certificate. The respondent has given Non-availability certificate. Now, petitioner is intending to register her event of birth in the records maintained by the respondent, as she is in need of her birth certificate for Documentation purpose.

2. After registration of the petition, notice was issued to respondent and it is duly served, but respondent does not chose to appear before this court and he placed ex party. Petitioner examined her self as PW.1 and Ex.P.1 to 5 are marked. Cross of PW1 taken as nil, as respondent remain ex party. Respondent evidence is also taken as nil.

3.I have heard the arguments and perused the records.

4.Now following points would arise for my consideration:

1) **Whether the petitioner has made out sufficient grounds to allow the petition?**

2) **What order?**

5. My answer to the above points is as under:

REASONS

6.POINT No.1:- PW1 being the petitioner she reiterated the petition averments in her examination in chief. Ex.P1 is the non availability certificate of non registration of her event of birth, issued by the respondent. Ex.P.2 is the copy of SSLC Marks Card, Ex.P3 is the copy of Aadhar card of Petitioner and Exs.P.4 and 5 are the copies of Aadhar Cards of her father and mother. The entry in the aforesaid documents reveals that, petitioner is the daughter of the petitioner and she was born on **17/03/2002**. The entries in the aforesaid documents corroborates with petitioner version. Ex.P2 to P5 are issued from the competent authority and its genuinity

cannot be doubted and deserved to be accepted. The entries in the aforesaid documents reveals and establishes that, the petitioner was born on **17/03/2002**.

7. The non-availability certificate issued by the respondent is marked as Ex.P1. It reveals that the petitioner date of birth was not registered in the respondent records. Petitioner alleged that, she is intending to register her event of birth for Documentation purpose. The purpose of filing of this petition and the documentary evidence on records remains unimpeached and unbuttered and same cannot be doubted and deserve to be believed. Further it is settled principle of law that, the entry of date of birth or death of a person, in the register of Birth or death is not a conclusive evidence of disputed date of birth or death. It is also true that the Order binds only the concerned Registrar of Birth or death and not others. Accordingly after verifying the correctness of date of birth of the petitioner, based on the undisputed documents relied by her, **I am answering this point in the affirmative.**

8.Point No.2:- For these foregoing reasons stated above to point No.1, I proceed to following:-

ORDER

The petition filed by the petitioner is allowed.

Respondent is hereby directed to enter the date of birth of petitioner that is **she was born on 17/03/2002** in their register and issue the birth

certificate to the petitioner by
collecting necessary fee if any.
