Fresh complaint case received. It be checked and registered.

Arguments heard on application u/s 175(3) BNSS
[156(3) Cr.PC].

It is the case of complainant that in the last week of July 2025, she came to know that her blank signed cheques, Pan Card and Aadhar Card were missing. Upon apprehension that her cheques may be misused, she gave a complaint in writing to PS Tilak Nagar and also registered NCT with the police and also informed her bank about the same and further blocked the missing cheques. It is further stated that thereupon accused no.2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 after acting in collusion with each other have misused the cheques of the complainant. Thereafter, the complainant sent a complaint to the concerned PS as well as to the DCP but no action has been taken.

Submissions heard. Record perused.

It is a trite law that before ordering registration of FIR u/s 175(3) BNSS, the court has to satisfy itself on the twin condition i.e. (I) commission of a cognizable offence & (ii) requirement of field investigation.

Keeping in view the facts of the present case, this Court is of the opinion that there is no requirement for field investigation as the complainant is having all the documentary evidences in her possession. Moreover, the custodial

interrogation of the proposed accused persons are also not required and even their identity and whereabouts are in the knowledge of the complainant.

Accordingly, complaint u/s 175(3) BNSS stands dismissed.

Complainant is given an opportunity to lead PSE.
