ORDER:

1. This is an application for seeking anticipatory bail under Section 482 BNSS filed by the applicant/accused **Kulveer Singh**, aged about 39 years, son of Ramjas Singh, resident of village Rogla, Tehsil Dirba, District Sangrur in the above noted case.
2. Notice of the bail application was given to the State. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor put in appearance on behalf of the State and record was also produced.
3. I have heard the learned counsel for applicant/accused, Additional Public Prosecutor for the State and also perused the record carefully with their able assistance.
4. It is submitted in the application as well as argued by the learned counsel for the applicant/accused that applicant/accused is a respectable, peace loving and law abiding citizen and has not committed any offence. It is further submitted that the present FIR has been registered on the statement of applicant/accused and the opposite party with a motive

to put pressure upon applicant/accused got registered the present GDR later on in connivance with the police by stating false and concocted averments therein. Applicant/accused has no concern with the alleged crime in any manner. Nothing is to be recovered from applicant/accused and as such his physical custody is not required by the police for further investigation. From the bare perusal of FIR, no offence is made out against applicant/accused. Nothing is to be recovered from applicant/accused and he is ready to join the investigation. Police is raiding the house of applicant/accused and he has apprehension of his arrest at the hands of police. Applicant/accused shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence or witnesses and shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court, so, he requested that he be released on bail.

5. On the other hand, while controverting the contentions of the accused/applicant, learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State has vehemently argued that the allegations against the applicant/accused are grave in nature and thus he does not deserve the leniency of the Court in grant of relief of anticipatory bail.

6. GDR No.37 dated 10.05.2026 in the present case was registered on the basis of the statement of complainant Gora Singh. He stated that he is an agriculturalist and the work of laying of pipeline was going on in the fields of their village and regarding this work, a village level Committee had been formed of which he was a member. On 07.05.2026, he was present in his field and along their fields, Kulveer Singh who had taken

on lease the land along with Satgur Singh and Lal Singh were present. At the time, JCB machine was working at the spot. At about 6:00 PM, when he asked the driver of JCB to lay the pipeline properly as per the site plan, Kulveer Singh (bail applicant) came there and started abusing him saying that he is the President of the Committee and the pipeline would be laid according to his wishes and he would teach him a lesson. Kulveer Singh then took out a Kirch like weapon from his waist and gave its blow towards him and he raised his left hand which hit under his left hand and he then gave blows with reverse side of said Kirch like weapon on his left arm besides giving fist blow on his neck. Satgur Singh and Lal Singh also grappled with him. He then fell down due to excessive blood coming out of his hand. He raised alarm upon which his nephew Jagtar Singh along with 3-4 persons reached the spot and seeing them, the assailants ran away from the spot with their weapon while threatening to kill him. His nephew Jagtar Singh got him admitted at Civil Hospital Kohrian where he was administered first aid and was then referred to Civil Hospital, Sunam where he was discharged on 09.05.2026. The motive behind the occurrence was that said Kulveer Singh (bail applicant) was getting the pipeline laid through the fields of complainant without any reason. He further prayed that an action be taken against the accused.

7. It is further to be noted that in the case in hand an FIR had already been registered on 08.05.2026 (i.e. prior to the **GDR No. 37** dated 10.05.2026) on the basis of statement of bail applicant Kulveer Singh

against Gora Singh (complainant in **GDR No. 37** dated 10.05.2026), Jagtar Singh, Makhan Singh and Pushpinder Singh on the allegations that when pipe line was being laid at around 03.00 P.M, he told the JCB driver Gurpreet Singh that he had done in the wrong place, to which he replied that he had done so at the instance of committee member Gora Singh. He further stated that he then got in touch with J.E. Hardeep Singh of the Irrigation Department, who asked the JCB driver to stop digging at that spot and work ahead. He further stated that around 06.00 P.M when he went to see the work of laying of pipe line Gora Singh came to the spot and questioned him regarding the stoppage of work by JCB at the earlier place, he told him that the same had been done at the instance of Hardeep Singh J.E of the Irrigation Department. He further stated that thereafter there was an altercation between him and Gora Singh and that he then left the place and started walking towards his fields. He further stated that Gora Singh then called up his nephew Jagtar Singh who came there along with Makhan Singh and Pushpinder Singh and encircled him and hurled abuses at him and that Pushpinder Singh then raised a lalkara asking the assailants to teach him a lesson. He further stated that Pushpinder Singh then hit him with a brick on his forehead and Jagtar Singh hit him with a brick on his right arm and Makhan Singh gave blow with a brick to the left side of his back and Gora Singh gave blow with a brick to his left calf and that resultantly he fell down and raised alarm and was rescued.

8. MLR of Kulveer Singh conducted on 07.05.2026 is there on record showing a total of 05 injuries on his person. Both parties were admitted in the hospital at around the same time. It is a matter of investigation as to who was the aggressor. In these circumstances, without commenting on the merits of the case, this Court is of the opinion that it is a fit case where the applicant should be released on interim bail. He is directed to join the investigation before IO/SHO concerned within **five days** from today. In that eventuality and in the event of his arrest, he is ordered to be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of SHO/Arresting Officer, subject to the following conditions.

- i. That the applicant will make himself available in the investigation of the case, as and when required;
- ii. That the applicant will not tamper with the prosecution evidence; and
- iii. That the applicant will not leave the country without prior permission of the court.

9. Now to come up on 21.08.2026 for submitting report with regard to joining of the investigation by the applicant.
