ORDER

Present bail application has been filed by accused/applicant
Kamaljit Kaur wife of Paramjit Singh seeking pre-arrest bail under
Section 482 BNSS. She also filed affidavit in support of the bail
application. It is stated that previously she filed bail application before

registration of the FIR which was dismissed as infructuous vide order dated 29.07.2026. Copy of said order is also placed on record. As per report of Ahlmad this is first bail application of accused/applicant and no other bail application of accused/applicant is pending in any court in this FIR.

2. Upon notice, learned APP for the State put in appearance on behalf of the State and contested the bail application. HC Gagandeep Singh, No. 1771/Patiala posted at PP Jansua, Police Station Sadar, Rajpura appeared alongwith record and suffered statement that he is not Investigating officer of this case but he has been authorized by him to appear in this court in the present bail application. He further stated that as per record, no offence has been added or deleted in the FIR and there are no MLRs of the complainant/injured.

3. Learned counsel for the accused/applicant submitted that accused/applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. He argued that first of all there is inordinate delay of 30 days in registration of the FIR and moreover there are no MLRs of the complainant party to prove any alleged injuries. He further submitted that only offence under Section 333 BNS is non bailable offence and said section has also been added only to harass the accused/applicant. He also submitted that infact the complainant party had caused injuries to Loveneet Kaur and he has also placed on record copy of her MLR dated 25.06.2026. Thus he prayed for granting concession of bail under section 482 BNSS to the accused/applicant, contending that her custodial interrogation is not required.

4. On the other hand, the learned APP for the State opposed the bail application contending that there are serious allegations against the accused/applicant that she alongwith other co-accused forcibly entered the house of the complainant armed with weapons and caused injuries. He also submitted that accused/applicant and her co-accused are rouge elements of the society and even the Gram Panchayat of the village had moved complaint against them at the Police Post Jansua regarding their illegal activities. Thus he prayed for dismissal of the application.

5. After hearing both the sides and after going through the record, this court finds that present FIR has been registered against Kamljit Kaur, Manjit Singh and Loveleen Kaur on 25.07.2026 on the statement of Gurdev Singh son of Surain Singh wherein he averred that on 24.06.2026, his son Jaskaran Singh was playing Volleyball in the village ground where son of Kamaljit Kaur was also playing. They had some dispute in the playground. Thereafter at about 7:00 PM, he heard noises outside gate of his house. When he went out, he saw that Kamaljit Kaur wife of Paramjit Singh, Manjit Singh son of Paramjit Singh and Loveleen Kaur were abusing them and were knocking the door with force. In the meanwhile, Manjit Singh scaled over the wall and came inside. He also opened the gate and all other accused forcibly entered in his house. Manjit Singh was holding Takua in his hand and he pushed him on the ground. Kamljit Kaur and Loveleen Kaur also gave him slaps. When his wife and children tried to intervene, all the aforesaid persons also caused injuries to them. Manjit Singh also gave

him fist blows when he tried to save his son and thereafter all the assailants ran away.

6. As per the police record, there are no MLR of any of the alleged injured. The occurrence is stated to be of 24.06.2026 but the FIR was got lodged on 25.07.2026, with the explanation that earlier they were trying to compromise the matter with the intervention of the Panchayat. The counsel for accused/applicant has placed on record MLR of Loveleen Kaur dated 25.06.2026 but there is no explanation on the part of the complainant regarding the same. All the offences are otherwise bailable in nature except offence under Section 333 BNS. Therefore in these circumstances, when there is no MLR of the complainant and his family members to prima facie show any injuries on their parts and considering the facts that there is inordinate delay of about 30 days in registration of the FIR, this court is of the opinion that investigation with respect to role of accused/applicant can be carried out without the arrest and nothing is to be recovered from her. Thus without commenting upon the culpability or non culpability of the accused/applicant and in order to facilitate the fair investigation, she is directed to join the investigation on or before 13.08.2026 and in the event of doing so, she will be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer and accused/applicant is directed to cooperate in the investigation, subject to the following conditions: -

1. That she will not hinder the ongoing investigation;
2. That she will not leave the country without prior permission of

the Court;

3. That she will not make any threat, promise or inducement to any person conversant with the facts of the case to dissuade him/her from disclosing the truth to the Court or police;
4. That she will join the investigation as and when asked by the investigating officer,
5. That she will cooperate with investigation in the matter of present case and further subject to the fulfillment of Section 482(2) BNSS

However the observations made herein shall have no effect on the merits of the main case. Police record be returned and now to come on 14.08.2026 for report and consideration.
