

Case called out before lok adalth.

The petitioner and respondents No. 3 and 4 who are the decree holders are present. Both parties and counsel are present.

The parties are identified by their respective advocates. Adhar cards are filed in proof of identity of the parties and filed compromise petition under Order 23 Rule 3 of C.P.C. stating that the matter is settled amicably and they prayed that decree may be passed in terms of Compromise Petition.

Perused the compromise petition, relationship of parties and nature of the suit. The contents of Compromise Petition are read over and explained to the parties. The parties have understood and admitted that the contents of Compromise Petition as true and correct and on examination by the Court, it is stated by the parties that they are entering into compromise with free will and there is no any

compulsion, coercion or fraud of any kind from anybody.

The parties have admitted the terms and conditions of compromise petition.

Respondents No. 2 and 3 by name Honnavva and Krishnappa are present and pays Rs.10,000/- by way of cash and the same is received and acknowledged by the petitioners.

In preliminary decree the petitioners were collectively allotted 10/12th share and respondents No.2 and 3 were collectively allotted 2/12th share in the suit properties.

Suit item No. 1 and 2 properties are agricultural properties and suit item No. 3 and 4 properties are VPC properties.

The commissioner submitted the report stating that, suit item No. 3 and 4 properties are not available for equal divisions.

Hence, parties entered in to the present compromise.

The petitioners agreed to receive the aforesaid amount and suit item No. 1 and 2

properties.

Respondents No. 2 and 3 were agreed to pay aforesaid amount and receive the suit item No. 3 and 4 properties.

Respondent No.1 by name Renukavva is also present.

However, there is no preliminary decree in her favor.

She valantly submits and agreed to the compromise and affixed her signature and photographs.

On perusal of the Compromise Petition and on examination of the parties, it appears that the parties are compromising the matter with their free will and voluntarily.

Therefore, I proceed to pass the following:

O R D E R

The Compromise Petition filed under Order XXIII Rule 3 of C.P.C. is hereby allowed.

The Suit is disposed of in terms of compromise.

Draw final decree accordingly.

The compromise petition shall form part and parcel of compromised final decree.

Office is directed to send the final decree to the deputy commissioner, Haveri to enter the name of petitioners in respect of suit item No. 1 and 2 properties in the revenue records as contemplated under order 26 rule 14(4) of cpc.
