

The appellant filed memo reported that the present appeal not press against the Respondent No.1.

The appellant No.1(a), appellant No.2 and 3 are present. The Respondent No.2,3,4,5,6,7 present. The both counsel for the parties are the present. After negotiation parties agreed to settle the matter voluntarily and amicably. Accordingly the parties to the case filed compromise petition U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC.

The terms of compromise petition which are in English language are read over to the parties. Having understood the terms of compromise petition, the parties submits that they are ready to compromise the matter as per the terms of the compromise petition. The parties submits that they are willingly and voluntarily compromising the matter and there is no threat or force from anyone.

The present appeal filed against the judgment and decree passed by the learned Civil Judge & JMFC Chincholi in OS 46/2011 dated 09-12-2013. Perused the compromise petition and entire materials on record. ORDER

The Compromise Petition filed U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC by the parties to the appeal is hereby allowed.

Appeal of the appellants is hereby decreed in terms of the compromise petition.

The memo and compromise petition shall form part and parcel of the decree.

Office is directed to draw compromise decree accordingly. Parties to furnish non-judicial stamp.
