

Case is advanced.

The plaintiff filed IA U/O 6 Rule 17 of CPC seeking to amendment of plaint as per mentioned in proposed amendment in application schedule.

The defendants counsel submitted no objection.

Heard, Perused IA it is noticed that there is not change of cause of action or nature of the suit.

Accordingly aforesaid IA is hereby allowed.

Amendment carried out and amended plaint filed.

The plaintiff filed memo reported that the plaintiff and defendant No.1 to 6 have settled the matter and filed compromise petition in view of the settlement the plaintiff does not press the suit as against the defendant No.7 to 10.

Therefore the present suit is here by dismissed as against the defendant No.7 to 10 as not pressed.

Plaintiffs and defendants are present.

Both counsels are present.

After negotiation parties agreed to settle the matter voluntarily and amicably.

Accordingly the parties to the suit filed compromise petition U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC.

The terms of compromise petition which are in English language are read over to the parties. Having understood the terms of compromise petition, the parties submits that they are ready to compromise the matter as per the terms of the compromise petition.

The parties submits that they are willingly and voluntarily compromising the matter and there is no threat or force from anyone. The suit is for the relief of Partition and separate possession.

Perused the compromise petition and entire materials on record.

The terms of compromise petition are acceptable and there are no legal impediments in accepting the compromise petition and the compromise petition is not against to the principles of natural justice and public policy.

The parties have put their signatures/thumb-impression on the compromise petition and also produced the xerox copies of their identity cards. The same is verified with the original identity cards of the parties. The compromise petition filed U/o 23 rule 3 of CPC is accepted.

Hence I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The Compromise Petition filed U/o 23 Rule 3 of CPC by the parties to the suit is hereby allowed.

Suit of the plaintiffs is hereby decreed in terms of the compromise petition.

The compromise petition shall form part and parcel of the decree.

Office is directed to draw compromise decree accordingly.
