

Case called in open court.

Plaintiff, defendant and their respective Counsels are present.

Both parties filed the compromise petition U/o 23 Rule 3 R/w section 151 of CPC, same is signed by the plaintiff and defendant and their respective counsels.

The contents of compromise petition is read over to the parties in the open court. They admits its contents as true and correct.
