Plaintiffs and defendant and their counsel present. On advise of Lok-Adalath, both parties have settled the matter amicably. Both parties filed compromise petition U/O 23 rule 3 of CPC.

Heard and perused the documents.

In the compromise memo it is stated that the plaintiff and Defendant have settled the matter amicably and the Defendant has agreed not to interfere in the Plaintiffs property. Both parties have also stated that they have agreed that there is no future claims against each other in future. The contents of the compromise petition is read over and explained to the parties. They have understood the same and admitted the contents and terms expressed in compromise petition as true and correct. Parties to the suit have voluntarily agreed to the compromise petition and admitted that decree may be drawn in terms of compromise petition.
