

Counsel for defendants files an application U/o 32 rule 7 R/w section 151 of CPC seeking permission to the defendant No.1 to enter into compromise on behalf of minor defendant No. 2. In the affidavit annexed to the application it is stated that the compromise entered into between the parties is for the benefit of minor defendant No. 2. Further permission is sought to enter in to compromise on behalf of minor defendant No. 2 as the same will benefit the minor defendant No. 2. Hence it is prayed to allow the application. Further counsel for defendants files certificate stating that the proposed compromise is for the benefit of minor defendant No. 2. Hence application is hereby allowed and permission is accorded to defendant No.1 to compromise on behalf of minor defendant No. 2 as the compromise seems to be lawful and beneficial to the minor defendant No. 2. Both the parties and their counsel present. Counsel for plaintiff and defendants files an application U/o 23 rule 3 of CPC stating that both parties have settled the matter. Along with the application they have also produced hand sketch showing the division of property between parties. Aadhar cards of both the parties is produced. Perused the same. The contents of the compromise petition is read over and explained to plaintiff and defendant No.1. They have voluntarily admitted

the contents of the compromise petition. Further, minor defendant No. 2 represented by her next friend admitted the contents of compromise petition. Further, counsel for defendants has also filed certificate certifying that the compromise is for the benefit of minor defendant No. 2. Perused the compromise petition and all the parties are getting equal share in the suit property. As such Compromise petition is acceptable and lawful. Hence compromise petition is accepted. Hence, application filed U/o 23 rule 3 of CPC is hereby allowed and consequently this suit is decreed in terms of compromise petition. Draw compromise decree accordingly and the hand sketch produced along with compromise petition forms part of compromise decree.
