ORDER

Apprehending their arrest the petitioners, who are the accused Nos.1 to 4 in Cr.No.54/2026 of Women Police Station, Kolar, registered for the offences punishable under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 352, 85 and 351(2) r/w Section 3(5) of BNS, have invoked the jurisdiction of this Court under Section 482 of BNSS praying to release them on bail in the event of their arrest in the above case.

2. The learned Public Prosecutor has filed objections.

3. According to prosecution the accused No.1 and complainant were in love with each other and about 6 months ago in Nallagangamma Temple in Kolar the accused No.1 tied sacred knot/Taali to the complainant accepting her as his wife and thereafter led life with her. The complainant has conceived. On 08.04.2026 the accused Nos.2 to 4, who are parents and cousin of accused No.1, took accused No.1 along with them. Since then the accused No.1 did not return to the house of complainant. When the complainant tried to contact him over phone it

was switched off. On 15.05.2026 when she had been to the house of accused in order to meet the accused No.1, then all the accused allegedly abused her and threatened to her life and also caused hurt to her by assaulting with stick and hands. Her friends rescued her. Thereafter she lodged the FIR.

4. Heard.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application by submitting that investigation is still in progress and if released on bail, the petitioners may tamper with prosecution case.

6. Perused the records. All the offences are triable by Magistrate. The dispute arises out of matrimonial relationship. The petitioners seems to have strong roots in the society. They undertake to abide by the conditions to be imposed by this Court. Hence, in my opinion they could be admitted to bail. The apprehension of prosecution could be addressed by imposing conditions. Hence, I proceed to pass the following;

ORDER

The bail application is allowed.

In the event of their arrest in Cr.No.54/2026 of Women Police Station, Kolar, the petitioners/accused Nos.1 to 4 are directed

to be released on bail, subject to following conditions;

1. They shall execute personal bond and offer a surety for Rs.20,000/- each.
2. They shall cooperate with investigation and shall not tamper with prosecution case.
3. They shall not commit similar offence.
4. The petitioners No.1, 2 and 4 shall surrender before the I.O., within 15 days from today and on such surrender they shall be released on bail.
