

Counsel for petitioner & respondent No.2 files joint memo reporting settling of the claim for Rs. 62,000/-. The petitioner is present before the tribunal. The contents of joint memo are read over and explained to the petitioner and he agrees to it and prays for allowing the petition accordingly. There are no reasons not to accept the joint memo filed by the petitioner and the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent. The settlement appears to be voluntary & for the betterment of the petitioner. Hence, no impediment to accept the compromise. Accordingly this tribunal proceeds to pass the following

### **ORDER**

The joint memo filed by the petitioner and the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent is accepted. The petition filed U/Sec. 166 of MV Act by the petitioner is allowed in terms of the compromise petition.

The petitioner awarded with compensation of Rs. 62,000/-.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent shall deposit the said compensation amount within three months, failing which they shall pay interest at the rate of 6% from the date of petition till payment.

After deposit of the amount by the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent the entire amount is ordered to released in favour of the petitioner after proper identification.

In view of the settlement reached there is no order as to cost.
