

The petitioners No.1 & 2 and their counsel Sri. N.P.K., are present. Respondent and his counsel Sri. C.S., are present.

Both parties and their counsels have filed compromise petition stating that, the petitioners have filed CMC No.9/2009 seeking maintenance and same was disposed on 11.03.2009 directing the respondent to pay monthly maintenance of Rs.3,000/- p.m., from the date of petition and default the petitioners have filed this petition bearing CMC No.267/2015 and other petitions in CMC Nos.266/2015, 89/2018 and 90/2018.

The parties as per advise of elders have settled the dispute and the respondent agreed to pay Rs.9,00,000/- as permanent alimony to the petitioners towards one time settlement. Accordingly, the respondent paid Rs.1,00,000/- to the petitioners on last date of hearing and has paid Rs.2,00,000/- on this day. The respondent further agreement to pay remaining balance amount of Rs.6,00,000/- in 3 monthly installments.

The terms of compromise petition are read over to the parties, who are stated the same as true & correct and prays to accept compromise petition as per terms mentioned therein.

The learned counsel for petitioners filed a memo stating compromise entered between the parties in this petition as well

as CMC Nos.266/2015, 89/2018 and 90/2018. As per said compromise, the petitioners are intending to keep pending CMC No.89/2018 and 90/2018 towards payment of balance settled amount as per compromise petition & prays to close this petition as fully satisfied. In view of compromise petition and memo, petition is hereby closed as fully satisfied.
