Claim for:

The petitioner prays this court may be pleased to pass an order :

- 1) Appointing the Petitioner as Guardian of the Ward
- 2) Directing the respondents to handover the Ward to the permanent custody of the petitioner.

3) Granting such other reliefs which this Hon'ble court may deems fit and proper as per the facts and circumstances of the above case, to meet the ends of justice and equity.

This appeal coming on this 11th day of July 2026, for final disposal before **Sri. Gowda Jagadeesha Rudre., B.Com. LL.B.**, Senior Civil Judge & JMFC., Mulbagal, in the presence of Sri.S.B.A., Advocate for the Appellant and Sri. K.R.B., Advocate for Respondent.

By consent it is ordered and decreed that :

Petitioner and Respondent No.1 are present along with their respective Advocates.

Sri. MSR, SBA and KRB Advocates files the compromise petition U/o 23 rule 3 of CPC along with their respective address proofs.

Advocates for Petitioner and Respondent No.1 have orally submitted that the Petitioner and Respondents have amicably settled the matter. On further enquiry, the petitioner submits that he has no objection leave his daughter with his parents in law. The contents of compromise petition are read over and explained to Petitioner and Respondent No.1 and 2 and both have voluntarily agreed the same.

Perused the compromise petition. They have admitted the contents of compromise petition. The terms of compromise are not against to any public policy or any of the provisions of law of contract. As such, there is no impediment to accept the compromise petition. Hence, Lok-Adalath proceeds to pass the following :

ORDER

Compromise petition filed by the parties under Order 23 rule 3 of CPC is allowed. Thereby the appeal is allowed in terms of compromise.

The Contents of the of Compromise Petition as follows:-

Compromise Petition Under order 23 rule 3 r/w Section 151 of CPC.,

The Petitioner and Respondents above named submit as under : -

1. The petitioner and respondents submit that in order to achieve peace amongst the parties herein, without any force or coercion and after being well aware of all the facts and law, the above suit has been compromised between the parties and as such the present Compromise petition is being filed.
2. At the outset, the Parties herein submit that the main premise for entering such compromise and filing this Compromise Petition is on basis of the below terms and conditions, averments and admissions between the parties :

Petitioner have filed the above suit seeking the following reliefs :

- a) Appointing the Petitioner as Guardian of the Ward.
- b) Directing the Respondents to Handover the Ward to the Permanent custody of the petitioner.
- c) Grant such other relief or reliefs as the situation demands to meet the ends of justice.

FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS :

A) It is now submitted that based on the above admitted averments and terms of this compromise, the parties to the petition have agreed to the Petitioner and Respondents/Maternal Grand mother and Grand father, the petitioner have a daughter by name Miss.Bhavana aged about 5 years, who is under the care and custody of the Respondents and shall continues to be so in future for which the Petitioner/Father has no objection. Further the petitioner has no objections for the Respondents to be the legal custodian and legal guardian of the minor daughter with the authority to sign all documents such as school/college and other documents pertaining to the minor child.

b) The petitioner/father to has visiting right, That the petitioner between the respondents shall bring the child to the residence twice in the month in the following manner.

c) Once in 15 days on Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. After two months the petitioner shall have liberty to go to the residence of the Respondents on Sunday by 10 a.m. once in 15 days and may bring the child along with him to the residence of the petitioner and he shall also have liberty to keep the child till Sunday 5 p.m., and thereafter the petitioner shall take back the child to the residence of the Respondents before 7 p.m.

d) The petitioner also he is having liberty to take home Ward/Child for 5 days in summer vacation. The petitioner may also take the child for the festivals like Deepavali, Kavadi and Grama Jathra 2 days each for the above 3 occasions.

These terms and conditions are strictly bending up on the petitioner as well as the Respondents, if any party to not co-operate to these terms and conditions the other party is at liberty to take the legal action.

4. It is submitted that all the parties are well aware of the facts and understood well the contents of this compromise petition. The parties have physically presented themselves before the Hon'ble court and have agreed to the terms of this compromise without any force or coercion.
