**** First Anticipatory Bail application under Section 482 of BNSS. ****

ORDER:

This order of mine shall dispose of a bail application under
Section 482 BNSS for granting anticipatory bail filed by the

applicant/accused Paramjit Kumar, in complaint titled as “The Nawanshahr Primary Cooperative Agriculture Development Bank Ltd. Nawanshahr Vs. Paramjit Kumar, No.398-2021”.

2. The learned counsel for applicant/accused has vehemently argued that applicant is innocent and has no concern with the alleged transaction in any manner. The applicant has never issued the alleged cheque. The applicant never appeared before the trial court and never misused the concession of bail. He came to know regarding the pendency of the above said litigation in second week of June 2025. The complainant managed to get him declared proclaimed person on 13.09.2023. Hence, present bail application is filed and prayer has been made for granting the anticipatory bail to the applicant/accused.

3. Whereas, on the other hand, learned Additional Public Prosecutor, appearing on behalf of State assisted by learned counsel for complainant has opposed the bail application and prayed for its dismissal.

4. I have heard Ld. APP for the State as well as Ld. Counsel for the accused/applicant and have perused the record of Ld. Trial Court. The record of trial court reveals that accused was declared proclaimed person on 13.09.2023. The accused never appeared in the court and never misused the concession of bail. After going through the record, this court is of the view that present application deserves dismissal being not maintainable. Admittedly, the offence in this case is bailable and it is settled law that no anticipatory bail application is maintainable in bailable

offences. It has also been held in **Hardev Singh @ Debu Vs. State of Punjab, 2011(2) RCR (Criminal) 471**, that if an accused is declared proclaimed offender in bailable offence, then ordinarily he should not be sent to jail if he is ready to furnish bail bonds and surety bonds as per the directions of Trial Court, in a bailable offence. In view of ratio laid down in the above referred authority as well as in view of facts and circumstances of the case specially that accused never appeared in the court and never misused the concession of bail, present application is dismissed being not maintainable.

5. My observations made here-in-above shall have no effect on merits of the case. File of bail application be consigned to the record room and record of the learned Trial Court, with a copy of this order, is ordered to be sent back to the quarter concerned.
