**ORDER**

1. File put up before me today being Duty Officer as the

learned Presiding Officer is availing Summer Vacation. By this order, this Court intends to dispose off the present bail application under Section 438 Cr.P.C having been filed by applicant Baljit Singh.

2. This FIR has been registered on the statement of complainant Balwinder Singh with the allegations that the applicant/accused Baljit Singh alongwith non applicants Yadwinder Singh, Baljinder Singh, Jaswinder Singh, Sukhbir Singh and Apninder Kaur approached his relative Amar Singh with a proposal of getting a qualified person employed as Ticket Collector in the Railway Department on payment of Rs. 8 Lac. It was on the basis of said inducement that on coming to know about the said proposal to be genuine through his relative Amar Singh, the complainant agreed to secure the job on payment of Rs. 8 Lac which amount was paid on various occasions. It is the allegation of complainant that at the time of making initial payment of Rs.4,00,000/- in cash he handed over his Aadhar Card, 10 + 2 certificate, Caste Certificate, Passport etc. to the applicant/accused and his associates who again assured the complainant to secure the proposed job for him. It was on 17.12.2019 that the medical examination of the complainant was got conducted

and a joining letter was also handed over. The complainant was then sent for training at Calcutta on 29.12.2019 where he undergone training for one month and he was asked to hand over the appointment letter and medical certificate to the accused persons. After completion of training of one month he returned back home but thereafter, he neither received any call from the department nor the accused responded to his requests and the entire process proved to be fake. In this way, the applicant and his associates under the false promise of securing a job for the complainant in Railway Department received an amount of Rs.8 Lac but their promise proved to be false. Even money of the complainant was not returned.

3. Notice of the bail application was served upon the State through learned Additional PP alongwith copy of bail application, who received the same, appeared and contested the bail application on merits. Police record was requisitioned which has been received and perused.

4. I have heard the respective contentions of both the learned Advocates and have perused the record with their able assistance.

5. The careful perusal of record reveals the nature of such

allegations to be serious and specific in nature. The complainant has been duped for an amount of Rs. 8 Lac on the false pretext of getting him a job in the Railway Department and even he has been made to undergo a fake training, and medical examination. An appointment letter was also given to the complainant which is cleverly stated to have been taken back by the accused on receipt of entire money which is paid in cash as well as through bank accounts. The modus operandi of the accused and the entire nexus has to be unearthed through detailed investigation so as to save other innocent persons from being duped in a similar manner. Keeping in view the nature of allegations, the custodial interrogation of the applicant seems necessary making out no special case in favour of the applicant for grant of bail under section 438 Cr.PC. Hence, this application for bail stands dismissed being without merits. Police record be returned and bail application file be sent to the concerned court for consignment. -Sd/-
