**ORDER**

1. By this order, this Court intends to dispose of this 1<sup>st</sup> bail application under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 having been filed by applicant Subegh Singh.

2. Notice of the bail application was served upon the State

through learned Additional PP attached to this court alongwith copy of bail application, who received the same, appeared and contested the bail application on merits. Police record was also requisitioned which has been received and perused.

3. Applicant-accused has submitted that he is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the present case. That a recovery of 300 grams Opium and Rs.3 lacs which is stated to be drug money has been planted upon him which does not fall in the ambit of commercial quantity. It is argued that the applicant is ready and willing to abide by all the directions of this court if he is ordered to be released from judicial custody on bail where he is lodged since 06.01.2025. A prayer for allowing this application has been made.

4. On the other hand, learned Additional PP has opposed this bail application on the ground that allegations leveled against the applicant are serious in nature. A prayer for dismissal of bail application has been made.

5. I have heard the respective submissions of both the sides and carefully gone through the police file.

6. Perusal of the police file reveals that applicant was arrested on 06.01.2025 and recovery of 300 grams Opium was effected from him which recovery apparently does not fall within the ambit of commercial quantity of this contraband as has been reflected in the schedule appended with NDPS Act so the provision of section 37 of NDPS Act is not attracted in this case. It is a question of evidence as to whether the

money recovered from the applicant is drug money or not. The applicant is in judicial custody since 06.01.2025. No useful purpose would be served by keeping the applicant behind the bar as presentation of challan and conclusion of trial is likely to take considerable period. Accordingly, the instant bail application under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 filed by the applicant stands allowed. He is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of this court subject to the following conditions :-

- A. That the applicant shall appear before the Trial Court on each and every date of hearing.*
- B. That the applicant shall not directly or indirectly induce or coerce any witness of prosecution so as to dissuade him from deposing as witness in the Court.*
- C. That the applicant shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.*

Applicant/accused be intimated immediately about granting bail to him through Superintendent, Central Jail, Amritsar through E-mail. Police record be returned and the file of this bail application be attached with the remand papers/challan file.
