

Case called before the Lok-Adalath.

Petitioner No. 1 to 5 are present, their advocate Sri. V.D.B is present, counsel for R-3 Sri. SNM is also present.

Wherein petitioner No. 2 to 5 are Minor.

At this stage, counsel for petitioners filed I.A. No.II U/o 32 Rule 7 of CPC with prayer to appoint the petitioner No.1 as minor guardian of the petitioner No. 2 to 5 and grant permission to comprise into the matter on behalf of minor petitioner No.2 to 5.

Sri.V.D.B. advocate furnished the certificate.

Heard the argument, perused and satisfied, IA is allowed, accordingly petitioner No.1 is appointed as minor guardian of petitioner No. 2 to 5 and

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permitted to compromise into the matter on behalf of minor petitioner No.2 to 5.

The learned counsels for the petitioners and respondent No.3 have furnished the Joint compromise Memo.

The matter is settled before the Lok-Adalath for a sum of Rs.27,00,000/-. We have checked the authenticity and confirmed about the lawful settlement. We have satisfied by this compromise, entire claim of the party is fully settled and the Compromise is legal.

Hence, we accept the Joint compromise Memo and proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The joint compromise petition filed by the petitioners and respondent No.3 is hereby accepted.

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Consequently petition filed by the petitioners U/sec 166 of MV Act is hereby allowed in terms of joint compromise memo.

Respondent No.3 has agreed to pay the settled amount of Rs. 27,00,000/- in favour of petitioners within 2 months from the date of this order.

Shares are allotted to the petitioner No.1 to 5 at the ratio of 60:10:10:10:10.

If the petitioners furnished the bank details Pan cards and Adhar Cards, respondent No.3 is directed to pay the entire shares of the petitioners infavour of their accounts within 60 days from the date of this order and intimate to this tribunal.

Further banker of the petitioners is directed to release 75% share of the petitioner No.1 in her favour on proper identification and proof and deposit remaining 25% of her share in the name

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of petitioner No.1 and handover the deposit slip in her favour and intimate to this tribunal.

Further their banker is directed to deposit entire shares of the petitioner No. 2 to 5 in their names till they attains the age of majority and handover their deposit slips in favour of petitioner No.1 and intimate to this tribunal.

Accordingly case is closed before the Lok Adalath.

Parties have to bear their own cost.

Draw award accordingly.
