Examination in chief by the Public Prosecutor.

Since 12 years I am working as Asst. Professor at Department of Forensic Medicine, Mysore Medical Collage, Mysore.

2. Pertaining this case On 21.11.2022, a dead body of a person by name B.R.Arungowda @ Kappe, aged

about 24 years was brought to the hospital with a requisition of Investigation Officer to conduct autopsy. On the same day, I have conducted autopsy between 3.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m.

3. On external examination of the dead body, I found there were about 13 external injuries on the dead body. They are mentioned in detail as follows.

- I. Laceration measuring 03 x 0.5 cm with muscle deep was present over center of occipital region.
- II. Laceration measuring 6 x 0.5 cm with bone deep was present over left parietal region.
- III. Laceration measuring 4 x 0.5 cm with bone deep was present over left eye brow.
- IV. Laceration measuring 3 x 0.05 cm with bone deep was present over center of forehead.
- V. Abrasion measuring 5 x1 cm present over back of right shoulder.
- VI. Laceration measuring 1 x 1 cm with muscle deep was present over right side of upper lip.
- VII. Abrasion measuring 3 x 2 cm was present over left cheek.
- VIII. Abrasion measuring 4 x 2 cm was present over right side of mandible.
- IX. Abrasion measuring 1 x 0.05 cm was present over left elbow.

X. Abrasion measuring 4 x 3 cm was present over front of left forearm.

XI. Multiple abrasions were present over left leg varying from 2 x 1 cm to 0.05 x 0.5 cm.

XII. Multiple abrasions were present over left foot varying from 4 x 2 cm to 2 x 1 cm.

XIII. Multiple abrasions were present over right leg varying from 3 x 2 cm to 1 x 1 cm.

4. On examination of scalp it showing extravasation all over the scalp there was a tissue fracture of 10cm present over frontal bone of scalp and comminuted fracture measuring 10 x 6 cm. present over the occipital bone. Membrane was lacerated. There was a subdural and subarachnoid hemorrhage present over both cerebral hemispheres and base of the brain.

5. The other part of the body I.e. chest wall ribs heart and large vessels were intact. Lungs were congested, stomach was containing 100 ml of partially digested food and no unusual smell was present. Kidneys were congested, bladder was empty and other organs were intact.

6. All the injuries were antemortem in nature. Abrasions were red in colour. Blood was effused around fracture site.

Blood was soaked gauze and handed over to the concerned police for grouping and final opinion was reserved pending for the want of chemical analysis report.

7. In that regard, I have issued postmortem report which is already marked as Ex.P.38 The signature of the witness is at Ex.P.38(a).

8. After the perusal of autopsy findings and chemical analysis report I have given opinion that the death is 'due to hemorrhage and shock due to head' injury sustained. However deceased had consumed alcohol at the time of the death.

9. On 12.01.2023, I received request letter from the Investigation Officer along with four packed, labeled and sealed articles i.e. 3 wooden logs and cement block for examination of the same and my opinion regarding the injuries on the dead body mentioned in the PM report.

10. On receipt of the same, I found the seals were intact. I examined the said three wooden logs and one cement block I have mentioned the details of the articles examined by me in the weapon examination report which is as follows:

I. Wooden log, hard and blunt object, simple weapon, irregular surface, measures 49 cm in length, circumference is 23 cm, blood stained.

II. Coconut leaf base wood, hard and blunt object, simple weapon measures 58cm in length, width 15 cm, blood stained.

III. Wooden log, hard and blunt object, simple weapon, smooth surface, measures 119 cm in length, circumference 18cm, no stains.

IV. Cement block, hard and blunt object, simple weapon, irregular surface, measures 20.5 cm x 22 cm x 9 cm, no blood stains.

11. After examination of the same, the articles were re-packed, labeled, sealed, signed and handed over to the concerned police. After examination of articles I have given my opinion. stating that the injuries mentioned in the PM report could be caused by the above examined weapons and sufficient to cause death in ordinary course of nature.

12. Accordingly, I have issued final opinion letter. Now, I see the same. It is marked as Ex.P.39, signature of the witness is at Ex.P.39(a). Now I see the weapons examined by me before the court which are already been marked as MO-2, 6 to 8. I identify the same.

Cross examination: on behalf of Sri.HDR, Advocate for Accused:

It is true deceased has consumed alcohol at the time of death. It is true I have not mentioned the type of lacerations found on the dead body. It is true normally abrasions may cause if a person falls on a hard surface.

2. I have not mentioned the date of examination of weapons in my letter i.e., Ex.P.39. I have not mentioned nature of blood stains on the weapons examined by me as to whether the said stains were powdered or it was in a shape of drops. It is not true to suggest that only on the request of I.O. without examining material objects I have issued Ex.P.39. It is not true to suggest that it is mandatory to draw the picture of the weapon examined by me. It is not true to suggest that Ex.P.39 is created at the request of I.O.
