Contested challan received from the Virtual Traffic Courts web portal <https://vcourts.gov.in>. It be checked and registered.

The cognizance of the offence is already taken by the Virtual Court and a fine was proposed for summary disposal of case as per Section 208 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988. The violator has exercised option to contest the challan on web portal of virtual traffic courts and the challan is transferred to this court for further adjudication as per law.

It is prayed on behalf of accused that the violation of the traffic rule in question was not done intentionally and deliberately. It is further submitted that the accused will take care in future while obeying traffic rule, however, prays for a lenient view.

Submissions heard.

In my considered opinion, considering the fact that the offence in question was not intentional, accused stands **admonished** for the offence **u/s 112/183 M.V Act, 1988**.

In view of the same, challan is hereby disposed of.
