ORDER

1. Present petition has been filed by the petitioner Haswinder Singh, for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.161 dated 12.07.2026, under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 126(2), 351(2) and 3(5) of BNS, registered at Police Station, Badali Ala Singh.

2. In brief, the facts of the case are that FIR was registered on the basis of statement made by Gagandeep Singh son of Amarjit Singh. It was submitted that he is doing work of agriculture and there was money transaction with his cousin brother Haswinder Singh son of Jagtar Singh. On 11.07.2026, at about 6:30 PM, Haswinder Singh called him and told that he will teach him a lesson and Haswinder Singh asked about his whereabouts, to which, he told that he is at home. Thereafter, Haswinder Singh started abusing and at that time he was standing in phirni of the village. Then, Haswinder Singh was seen coming on his vehicle bearing No.CH-01-CC-5497 Volvo colour-silver at about 7:00 PM. He tried to run away but Haswinder Singh stopped him. From the car, four persons came out and Haswinder Singh was armed with kirpan and came towards him. Haswinder Singh gave kirpan blow and he raised his left hand and the blow hit on his left hand. Haswinder Singh again gave kirpan blow on his head but he caught hold his kirpan and the blow of kirpan hit near his left ear. Thereafter, Gurbinder Singh Balogi gave baseball blows and other two unknown persons gave danda blows to him. One of the person caught hold of him from his hairs and threw him on the ground. The passers-by rescued him and being frightened, he immediately ran towards his house. The assailants chased him but he closed the main gate of his house. These four persons threatened him to kill and neighbours started gathering when his mother raised hue and cries. Thereafter, with the help of neighbours, he was taken to Civil Hospital, Khera but since his condition was not good, therefore, the doctors referred him to General Hospital, Sector 32, Chandigarh. After treatment of his hand at Sector 32 Hospital and after taking X-ray, he was again sent back to Civil Hospital, Khera, where his

treatment is going on. The motive is that he had taken amount from his relative and returned some part but some amount was outstanding and for this reason, the dispute escalated. Action be taken.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that it is admitted in the FIR that there was a money transaction and the wife of the present complainant is working as Nurse and all the injuries are either self-suffered or manipulated. The petitioner is ready to join the investigation and the alleged injury on the hand is also manipulated. Thus, the petitioner may be released on anticipatory bail.

4. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor for the State along with learned counsel for the complainant submitted that name of unknown assailants is also to be ascertained and thus, custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required and thus, keeping in view serious nature of allegations, the petitioner is not entitled to be released on anticipatory bail. .

Learned counsel for the complainant also submitted that the present petitioner was involved in two other FIRs and thus, keeping in view serious nature of allegations, the petitioner is not entitled to be released on anticipatory bail.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Public Prosecutor for the State along with learned counsel for the complainant. As per the allegations, the present petitioner is alleged to be armed with kirpan and is alleged to have given kirpan blows on the left hand as well as near the left ear of the complainant. As per the MLR, following injuries were given on the person of the complainant:

Sr. No.	INJURY DETAILS
1.	Bruise mark blue purple 5 X 3 cm over left lumbar region.
2.	8 X 6 cm bruise mark red purple left lateral femur region. Advice : Orthopedician.
3.	3 X 1 cm reddish bruise over right forearm. Advice : Orthopedician opinion.
4.	Multiple abrasion mark 5, 4, 3 cm in length over right upper lateral chest area.
5.	Superficial laceration wound over left side of face over parotid region. Clotted blood.
6.	4 X 2.5 cm bruise reddish blue left lateral upper arm. Advice: Orthopedician opinion
7.	Complain of broken-crack left lower premolar tooth. Advice: Dental opinion
8.	Complain of pain and swelling over left parietal region of skull. Advice: Surgeon opinion
9.	As noted injury in emergency register by first contact doctor and picture clicked and seen to me by first contact doctor the injury is following- incised deep wound about 3-4 cm in length, clear edges, left hand Advice: Orthopedician opinion.

It is the case of the prosecution that custodial interrogation of the present petitioner is required to ascertain the names of the unknown assailants and the weapon of offence is to be recovered. Thus, keeping in view serious allegations, without commenting on the merits of the case, no ground is made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner and thus, the present petition for grant of anticipatory bail is dismissed. File be consigned to Record Room.
